The Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR) is a ground-breaking EU legislation designed to revolutionise the way we handle packaging. As such, it will have a massive impact on all companies in the European supply chain that use packaging – including yours.

The PPWR in short

- By 2030, all packaging must be recyclable, and by 2035, it must be recycled at a large scale
- The PPWR mandates the use of reusable packaging, setting specific targets for transport packaging like reusable pallets and trays.
- The PPWR will apply from 12 August 2026 onwards.

This regulation is a significant step towards a more sustainable future, and it's crucial for organisations to understand its requirements. As the detailed requirements of the PPWR are still being developed until mid-2026, the precise implications for your organisation still have to be fully defined. To make sure you're well-prepared to meet your responsibilities, we strongly encourage you to proactively monitor the PPWR's evolution and start evaluating the potential impact on your operations without delay.

How the PPWR can benefit your company

Adhering to the requirements in the PPWR is an opportunity for companies to enhance sustainability practices, reduce waste, and improve operational efficiency. The regulation aims to minimise packaging waste, promote reuse, and ensure that packaging is designed for recyclability. For FMCG companies, growers, and retailers, this means transitioning from single-use packaging to reusable solutions could be a more cost-efficient and sustainable solution. By complying with the PPWR, companies demonstrate their commitment to environmental responsibility and align with the broader goals of the European Union.

Focus trends in the PPWR



To prepare for the PPWR, organisations must focus on several key areas:

- **Reducing packaging waste:** Minimise empty space and restrict unnecessary packaging elements. Efficient design and space optimisation during transport are essential.
- **Promoting reuse:** Achieve ambitious reuse targets for transport packaging. By 2030, 40% of your transport packaging must be reusable, and by 2040, this target increases to 70% (exemptions apply).
- **Meet recycled content requirements:** Ensure that transport packaging is designed for recyclability. Minimise composite materials and facilitate easy disassembly. Decrease the use of virgin materials to put the sector on track to climate neutrality by 2050.

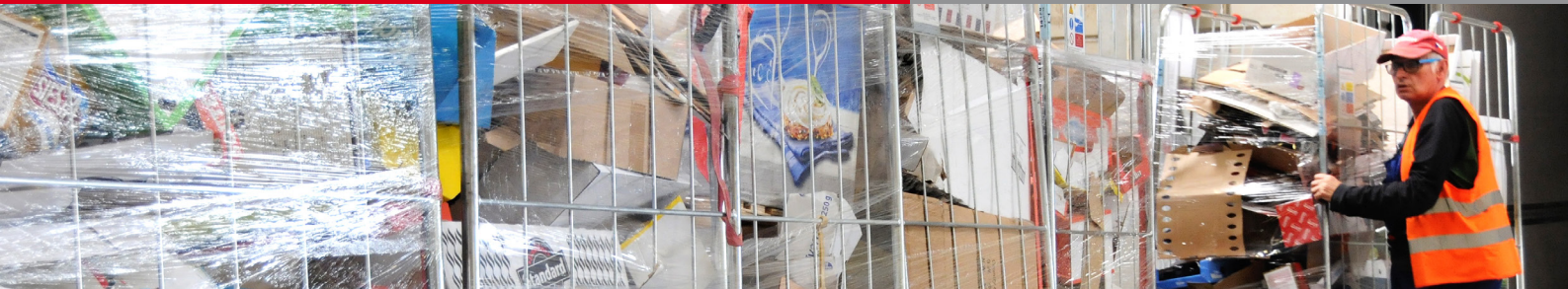
